

### Catch Up Funding Spending Plan 2019/2020

#### **What is catch up premium and how is it used at Ormiston SWB Academy?**

Catch up premium is additional funding given to schools to support pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or mathematics at the end of Key Stage 2. It is up to schools to decide how to use the funding most effectively to support students who have not reached the expected standard.

For the academic year 2019/20, Ormiston SWB Academy expects to receive approximately £20,000 Catch Up funding. The funding will be allocated as follows:
