What do I need to know before starting the course?

- ◆ You will study English Language alongside English Literature and will, therefore, be studying towards **TWO GCSEs**.
- ◆ You will read a wide range of fiction and non-fiction texts from various themes such as diversity, discrimination, and current and historical events.
- ◆ You will write in a variety of styles and formats including writing speeches, articles and leaflets. You will also have the option to practice and improve your oracy skills during debates and discussion work.
- ◆ There will be no coursework or controlled assessments. Both courses are 100% examination that will be sat at the end of year 11.
- ◆ There is a spoken language element that will assess your ability to present information in a formal way which gives a separate accreditation of a Pass, Merit or Distinction.

What do I need to know before starting the course?

- ◆ You will develop your inference skills and learn how to write analytically about different texts. You will develop your confidence at having opinions linked to why an author has made the choices they have and be resilient when facing longer and more challenging texts.
- ◆ There will be no coursework or controlled assessments. Both courses are 100% examination that will be sat at the end of year 11.
