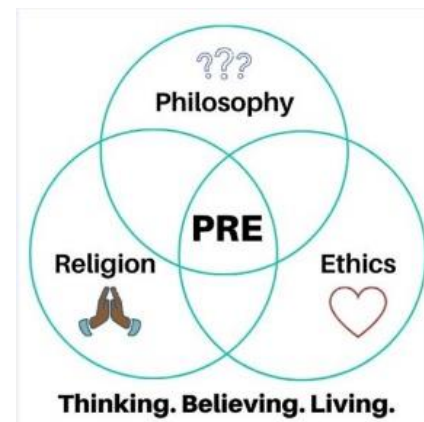
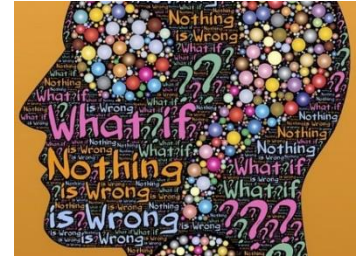

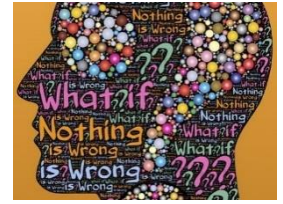

What will I study?



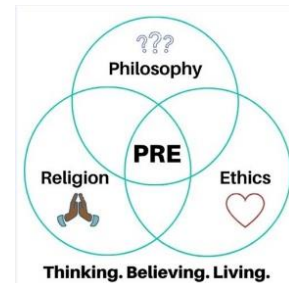
Paper 1: The Study of Religions (50%)

An in depth study of the beliefs, teachings and practices of **Christianity** and **Sikhism**. You will visit both **places of worship** and learn about holy books, buildings, practices, festivals etc. of each religion.

Paper 2: Thematic Studies (50%)

Application of a range of views, including Christian and Sikh views, to the contemporary themes of:

- **Relationships and Families**
- **Religion and Life**
- **Crime and Punishment**
- **The Existence of God and Revelation**

The exam involves 5 types of questions for each topic: a multiple choice, a short 2-mark question, 2 medium questions of 4 and 5 marks, and a longer 12 mark question.
