

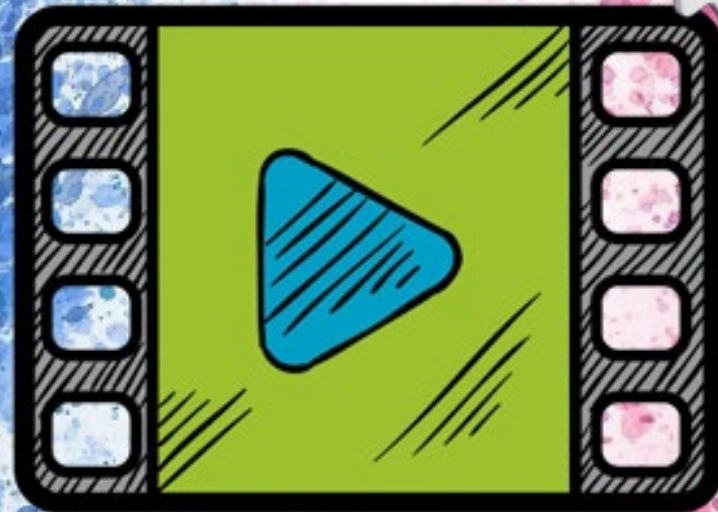

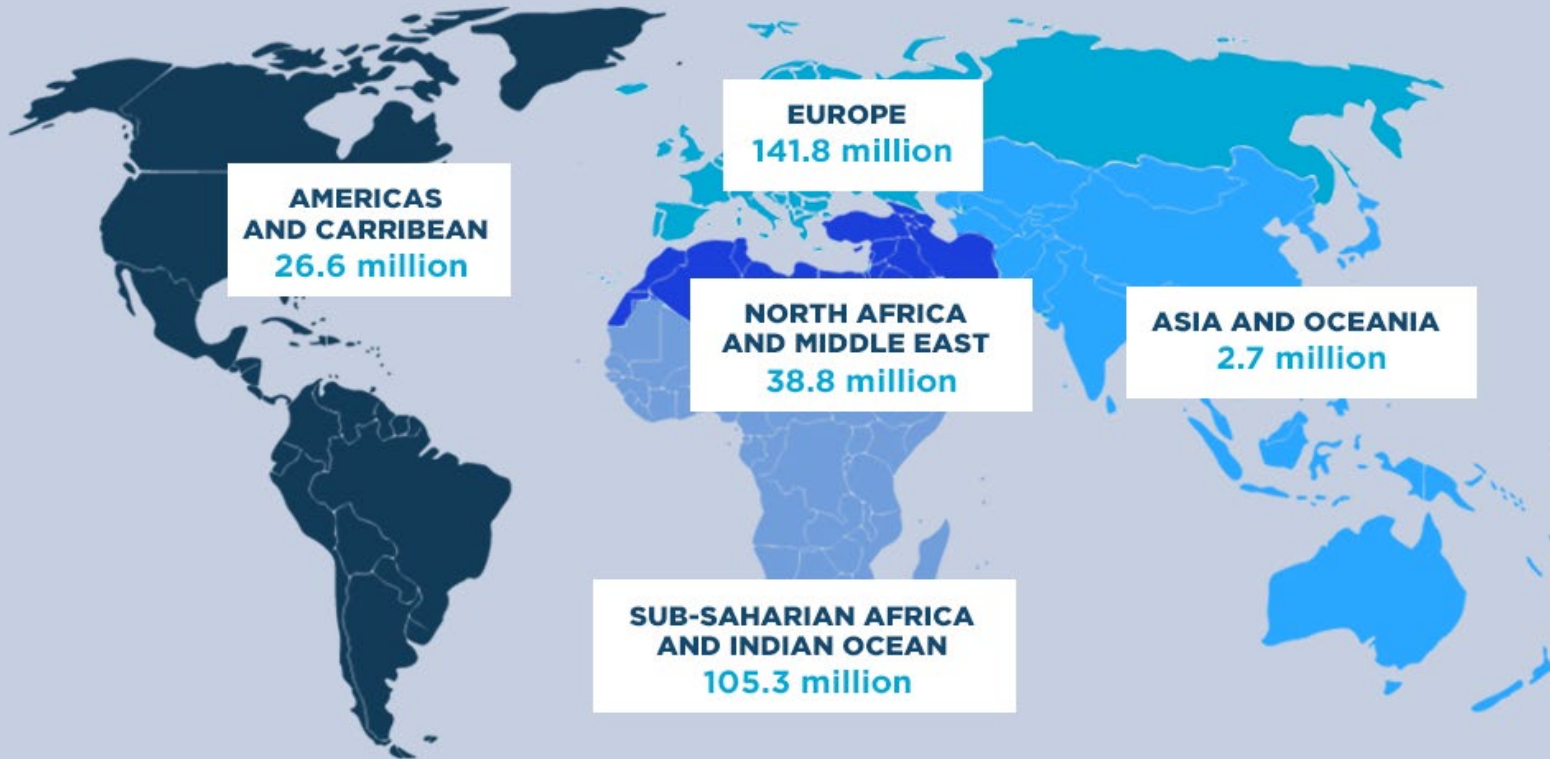

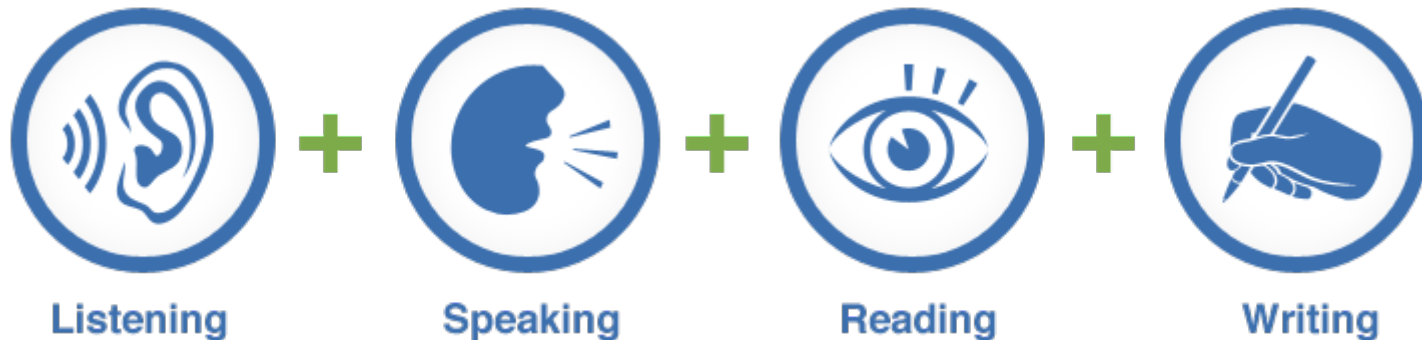
Paper 1: Listening (25%)
