OUR OUTSTANDING FACILITIES

Ormiston SWB Academy occupies a state-of-the-art building that provides an amazing and inspiring environment for students, teachers and wider community.

It's design incorporates a superbly equipped performance hall, newly installed fitness suite and dance studio, lecture theatre, a state-of-the-art engineering hall, a professional boardroom and range of stylish indoor and outdoor dining spaces.

The building design gives an amazing view both of the surroundings and of the interior with dramatic double and triple height spaces. The interior facilities are complemented by thoughtfully designed school grounds: with grass sports pitches, a full size artificial astroturf grass pitch, a multi-use games area, an eco-garden and a series of 'outdoor gardens', as well as providing the students immediate access and use of the superb facilities at the neighbouring Bert Williams Leisure Centre.

In addition and response to the growing demand for pupil places, our academy is expanding to provide an enhanced learning environment for all students. This exciting development includes the addition of a dedicated Sixth Form area, modern classrooms, state-of-the-art IT suites, and spacious dining facilities, ensuring students have access to the best resources for their education and well-being. Furthermore, a single-storey pupil support unit will be introduced to offer tailored assistance, fostering a supportive and inclusive atmosphere. With these new facilities, we continue our commitment to excellence, equipping students with the tools they need to thrive academically and personally.

OUR CURRICULUM

OUR CORE PURPOSE IS TO PROVIDE A FIRST-CLASS EDUCATION. EVERY CHILD (REGARDLESS OF STARTING POINT, DISADVANTAGE OR SEND NEED) HAS THE RIGHT TO ACQUIRE KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS IN EVERY SUBJECT BEFORE THEY LEAVE ORMISTON SWB ACADEMY.

We want to create consistency and alignment across the Academy so that every classroom can share in our collective knowledge of what makes for the best curriculum, the best teaching and valuable assessment. Students are taught a broad and balanced range of subjects at KS3 to give them the widest possible choice when it comes to selecting their GCSEs/A levels and their future career before leaving Ormiston SWB Academy.

We operate a three-year KS3 programme with the aim of providing students a broad and balanced curriculum in a range of subjects before specialising at KS4 and beyond. In Year 7 and Year 8 we are focussed on ensuring students master skills in numeracy, literacy and ICT whilst also developing the life skills they need to become responsible adults. Alongside this, students study English, Maths, Science, Technology, Computing, Humanities, PE and Modern Foreign Languages. Students also participate in a weekly life skills/CORE lesson which encompasses skills and knowledge to develop themselves as learners and as members of the wider community.

During Year 9, students select their options from a vast range of subjects so that they are able to pursue their goals which may be in further education, or training. We work with parents to provide individual information, advice and guidance to support students in making the right choices and to achieve their potential.

At post-16, students have the opportunity to apply for SWB 6th to further their studies. Our commitment is to supporting all of our sixth form students to achieve the best possible qualifications whilst also providing them with the life skills they need to develop into respectful young adults who have happy and successful lives. We are very ambitious for our students, particularly those in SWB 6th, and expect their hard work and dedication to be rewarded with excellent grades.





C.O.R.E CURRICULUM/ ENRICHMENT

WE BELIEVE IN THE IMPORTANCE OF ENRICHMENT. BY THIS, WE MEAN OPPORTUNITIES OUTSIDE OF THE CLASSROOM WHICH SUPPORT LEARNING AND BOTH PERSONAL AND CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT, BUT WHICH ALSO ALLOWS OUR STUDENTS TO DEVELOP THIER SOCIAL SKILLS WHILE HAVING FUN!

At Ormiston SWB Academy we believe academic success is really important, but we don't think it is everything. We want all our students to leave education feeling confident not only in knowledge, but also in personal skills and qualities essential to excel through life. Our C.O.R.E curriculum is intended to allow students to learn for life, equipping them with knowledge of the world, essential skills and careers guidance.

Our C.O.R.E Curriculum is built around our 4 values of Character, Organisation, Resilience and Excellence and organised into 5 sections;

- 1. C.O.R.E Futures Programme Through Years 7 to 13, students will study and take part in a several drop down days which include visits, courses, events and activitie.
- 2. C.O.R.E Timetabled Lesson Weekly 1 hour lessons in which students experience a comprehensive and progressive PSHE/RSE/Careers Programme.
- 3. Personal Tutor (PT) time all students have a Personal Tutor who they meet daily during PT time and complete a comprehensive programme of study.
- 4. Subject Links when and where appropriate students develop their C.O.R.E skills within normal timetabled lessons.
- 5. Enirhcment A range of after school clubs that promote and nurture wider hobbies and interests including; Sport, Art, Drama and Debating which also offer a wide variety of enrichment and educational visits to expand learning opportunities outside of the classroom. These include visiting places such as "Think Tank", the Black Country Living Museum, beaches, sports venues, historical castles and the theatre. We also have recreational visits as part of our reward incentives such as visiting theme parks, the cinema bowling and residential visits.

CARE SUPPORT AND GUIDANCE

Students are supported on a day to day basis by the Pastoral Team. This comprises of the; Safegaurding Team, Medical Officer and Year Teams.

Students attend Personal Tutor groups within their year group and enjoy a breadth of learning for life and enrichment opportunities during tutor time.

Staff in the Pastoral Team get to know every individual student very well and build strong working relationship with parents to enable you to join in celebrating your child's success and discuss any concerns you may have.

In addition, we have Senior Leaders who are responsible for leading students a through high expectations academically and embracing the Academy's ethos.



HOW TO APPLY

Applications to the Academy are made through the Local Authority's coordinated admissions scheme. Parents are required to complete the Common Application Form (CAF) which is sent by their Local Authority. If you would like to apply for a Year 7 place at the Academy you should name the Academy as one of your preferences on the CAF. Please click here for the City of Wolverhampton Admissions Document.

If the number of applications is less than the number of spaces then all children will be offered places. If the academy receives more applications than there are available places then children with the academy named on an education, health care plan (EHC) or equivalent will be automatically admitted to the academy. If there are still places available, priority for admission will be given to those children who meet the oversubscription criteria set out below:

Criterion 1: Looked after children

Looked after children and those who were previously looked after but immediately after being looked after was adopted or became subject to a child arrangements order or special guardianship order. A Looked After Child is either a child who is in the care of a local authority, or being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (definition used is in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989); or, those children who appear to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted. Previously Looked After Children are those who were previously looked after but immediately after being looked after were adopted or became subject to a child arrangements order or special guardianship order.

Criterion 2: Medical/Social

Whether there are specific medical or social circumstances that can be met only by the child's attendance at the preferred school.

Criterion 3: Siblings

Whether siblings attend the school and will still be attending the school in September.

Criterion 4: Distance

How close the child lives to the school requested, with those living closest to the school getting the highest priority. The measurement between home and school will be determined by the straightline measurement from the home address to the preferred school carried out by the LA's software.

Tie Breaker

If there is an insufficient number of places to accommodate all the children of a particular criterion, the next criterion will be used to assess the applications concerned in order to prioritise applications. If the number of applications is less than the number of spaces then all children will be offered places.
